CONNECTIONS

Barbara Turk

Theodore Parker, * a radical Unitarian theologian, minister, reformer, was born in Lexington, Mass, August 24, 1810. He attended Harvard Divinity School.

May 19, 1841 Parker delivered a sermon, "Discourse on the Transient and Permanent in Christianity", during the installation of Charles Shackford in South Boston, Mass.

An installation is a special ceremony. A church calls a minister, and the minister accepts. UU's then, and now, do not gain a minister by dictum of a "higher-up". We (church or fellowship), select a minister, and vice versa, a special bond, ending only if minister retires, or parties agree to separate.

That May 19th sermon added fuel to the Transcendentalist Controversy, and angered many of Parker's Unitarian colleagues, who banned him from their pulpits. ("How to win friends, and influence...")

Traditional Unitarians disapproved of the Trans (different connotation in 2023!), as they put less emphasis on Bible miracles, and traditional Christian observances, such as Communion. "According to Parker, the permanent contribution of Christianity was not its story, but its ethical laws." (Discussion topic?)

In 1845, back in Boston, Parker had formed the Twenty-Eighth Congregational Society of Boston. His popularity rose and he spoke, routinely, before 3,000.

A Biblical scholar, political radical, AND ardent abolitionist, he defied the Fugitive Slave Law by taking escaped slaves to live in his home. "He recorded that he wrote sermons with a loaded gun on his deck to defend these fugitives, if necessary."

After ten years of UUA discussion, and next a year's study to pass UUA's Principle 8 (2024) on racism. (Oh, to hear Teddy-boy's comments on it all.)

Parker died of TB on May 10,1860, in Florence Italy.
