The Flower Ceremony, sometimes referred to as Flower Communion or Flower Festival, is an annual ritual that celebrates beauty, human uniqueness, diversity, and community.

Originally created in 1923 by Unitarian minister Norbert Čapek of Prague, Czechoslovakia, the Flower Ceremony was introduced to the United States by Rev. Mája Čapek, Norbert's widow.

# Please Read Possible Purchase Opportunity

Dear members of the UUFKC,

We have an opportunity to purchase ourselves a home! Your Property Task Force has been looking for some time now at potential rental and purchase possibilities. On the rental front, it appears that there is basically nothing in Klamath Falls within our price range. Sharing with other churches is also problematic, as the few we've investigated would require that we meet in the afternoon.

On the purchase side, there is also almost nothing within our price range. BUT we found that the Grocery Pub 1201 Division Street in the Mills Addition has been for sale for some time, and we asked Sherry McManus, a broker with Coldwell Banker, to arrange to show it to us. The Task Force took a tour, had an unexpectedly positive feeling about it, and arranged for more of the congregation to tour it. Twelve members looked at it yesterday, and the general feeling was also positive.

It is not perfect, it does not fully provide for our needs and wants, but it is POSSIBLE and has the POTENTIAL to be a really good home for our Fellowship. AND we can afford it, using the property sale monies we have been saving for this eventuality. We did not even

know if we would be able to get a mortgage loan, but Sherry does some personal financing on her own, and she is willing to provide the needed funding for us. Her kindness makes it much easier and cheaper for us to make this purchase.

The asking price is \$175,000; Sherry would probably make an initial offer of \$150,000...and we'll see where we end up. We would plan to make a 20% downpayment, and finance the rest. The term of the loan will depend on what we think we can manage as a monthly payment, and we will have over \$30,000 left to help with the changes and improvements we would expect to make over time. To make the monthly loan payment and pay the operating costs we will depend on your continuing and possibly growing support.

This is a congregational decision. We need you to vote yea or nay on going ahead with this purchase, and we need to move quickly. Please respond to Faith at <a href="mailto:dfl5523@gmail.com">dfl5523@gmail.com</a> with an up or down vote. Drive past and look through the front windows and into the garden if you like....it's on Division Street at the crossing of Wantland Ave. We may be able to arrange a third tour of the interior if required, but time is of the essence and if you feel you can vote on our recommendation, we'd appreciate it.

For father's, "I think it not improbable that man, like the grub that prepares a chamber for the winged thing it has never seen but is to be—that man may have cosmic destinies that he does not understand. Mrs. John B. Dodd (no given name?!?), of Spokane, WA, asked for recognition of fathers. The Spokane ministerial alliance offered June's third Sunday; so proclaimed by Spokane mayor, and the state's governor. That was June 19, 1910.

But, it took longer (than a UUA G A vote), for an official Father's Day. In 1957 U S Senator Margaret Case Smith, in a proposal, wrote for 40 years Congress ignored fathers, "singling out just one of our two parents". LBJ signed a 1966 Proclamation; in 1972 Nixon's signature made it Public Law 92-278.

In 1865, when the last of those having been held in bondage in Texas were told they were free, it was June19th. The news' bearers, U S Army troops in Galveston, TX.

Opal Lee\*, a Black woman, shared, "Even into my 80's, I had a nagging feeling that I should be doing more". As if it wasn't sufficient, she had bachelor and master degrees, taught school, was a social worker, had a family, volunteered for Habitat for Humanity, AND her farm helped a food bank serve 500 families a day.

In 2016 she drew attention to "JUNETEENTH" by organizing a march from Fort Worth to Washington, D.C. In 2019 she started a petition earning 1.5 million signatures favoring a holiday. In 2021 Congress passed a federal holiday,

DADS, and those that <u>father</u>: "Senior", "some-experience", "brand new", do connect generations, like Opal (now 96 years young).
